**A new pipe organ and what it means to the sung prayer at our parish.**

I am so grateful to be a musician at this parish of Three Holy Women that supports the music ministry in such a comprehensive way. I have been around long enough to know that not every parish has 2 priests that sing and realize the importance of good assembly singing as well. As a parish, you have responded to our calls for new choir members, cantors and instrumentalists and are generous with your kind words and compliments when we do something really well. Most importantly, you sing and pray really well week in and week out. That is a testament to your faith and to the example of our clergy and the

leadership of our parish musicians such as cantors and choir members. You have always responded to the need for good instruments to lead this music ministry as well. Again, to be at a parish that has 3 church buildings and such wonderful instruments in each of them is a real gift to me and those who worship here. I am grateful.

When the organ committee was looking at various installations to decide on which company we wanted to hire, one of the guiding principles we used was – how well would this instrument lead us at our weekly Masses? ## Community Gardening

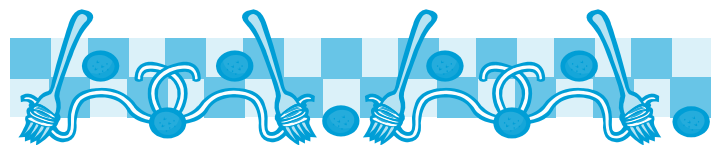
